

ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF SIMPSON, KENTUCKY, GRANTING TO THE FRANKLIN-SIMPSON PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION ALL FUNDS RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY FOR BUILDING PERMITS AND AN AMOUNT OF \$7,500.00 TO GIVE THE COMMISSION FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE FROM THE CITY AND COUNTY

WHEREAS, the County of Simpson and the City of Franklin desire to make the Franklin-Simpson Planning & Zoning Commission a financially independent body and in the furtherance of this purpose, the County of Simpson does hereby adopt the following ordinance:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the County of Simpson, Kentucky, as follows:

I.

All revenues received for building permits within the county of Simpson, shall effective July 1, 1984, be paid to the Franklin-Simpson Planning & Zoning Commission to be used by said Commission in furtherance of its duties;

II.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held valid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof;

III.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.
