Judge Barnes reported that Kentucky Transportation Cabinet will sponsor a "pop-up" to Issue drivers' license at the ag building at the community park Thursday, March 10° but according to reports all appointment slots were already taken. His report continued with information that HB212 had been signed into law by Governor Beshear starting of reapportioning of Fiscal Court districts in May of 2023. He also shared that a thank-you letter had been received from Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College for Simpson County Fiscal Court's continued support for their On-track program. He informed the court that the Goodnight House has a significant roof leak, and he had a quote for the repair for them to consider for approval.

Judge Barnes continued by reporting that to avoid paying \$82,000 in finance charges to Motorola for the radio equipment, the balance of \$737,535.50 which is 50% of upfront payment to Motorola will be paid by April 4, 2022, by each entity, city and county. Site evaluations were done by Motorola Monday, February 28th. He continued by mentioning that at a recent DLG Budget Workshop officials were reminded that a good time to review the administrative code is during the budget preparation season.

One such addition to the current administrative code that some of the officials would like to have considered is that no county employee, part-time or full-time, shall be employed by any vendor supplying goods or services to any county department

Magistrate Thurman advised Fiscal Court of a water drainage problem on Rogers Road which is part gravel and part asphalt. This road is located behind Groves Road off 31-W South in the area of Kentucky Downs and as the area has been developed, water can't drain fast enough off Rogers Road so water stands on it. Magistrate Thurman and Public Works Director Bobby Groves will continue to investigate the matter for the best solution. It was noted that Rogers Road ends on private property. Magistrate Thurman also wanted some accountability from Charter Cable's installation crew as officials are receiving complaints about messes that are left in the wake of the inground cable installation as well as the depth and distance from the road where it has been buried. He would like to have Ms. Sandusky with Charter provide a progress report at least quarterly.

Magistrate Poston has had complaints about large truck traffic on Vances Mill Road (CR-1347) and would like to see signage prohibiting commercial trucks.

Magistrate Downey reported that the chairman for the Midwest Regional Boys and Girls Club had met with the local board and conducted training for its members with particular attention to duties and responsibilities of board members and staff. As a Parks board member, he also reported that retiring Parks Director Terry Joiner was honored with a gathering and then Mr. Downey recognized and welcomed new Parks Director Lisa Deavers who was attending this meeting.

Magistrate Chandler requested that the speed limit on Kinnaird Road (CR-1152) be lowered from 55 mph to 45 mph. It was noted that if a county road does not have a speed limit posted, it is understood that it is 55 mph.

County Attorney Sam Phillips will research whether a blanket ordinance governing enforceable traffic regulations may be passed by Fiscal Court granting them the ability to set speed limits, signage or other traffic regulations they deem necessary on a particular road at any point in time. He also announced that the African American Heritage Center will open a new exhibit honoring Franklin native John J. Johnson, a prominent NAACP figure at the state and national level, on March 11th at 4:00 PM at the Brooks Wright Center. Attorney Phillips also read on behalf of Deputy Jailer Brent Deweese a statement disclosing that effective March 7, 2022, he will begin a position with the Bob Barker Company which is a vendor to the jail. That statement was submitted for the record to the fiscal court clerk. A copy of this statement will be retained in his personnel file and in this meeting's attachment file. Mr. Phillips reminded folks that late 2021 property tax payments not made at the Sheriff's Office by April 15th will be transferred as delinquent taxes to the County Clerk's for further collection and risk being sold to a third party at a tax sale usually held in August.

Judge Barnes asked that Jailer Vaughn work with the Adam Wilshire, the county's IT Specialist, to spec out the list of items that were presented and approved at the February 1st fiscal court meeting for jail purchases with the funds from the telephone commission from Combined Public Communications contracted thru the jail. Fiscal Court would like for the two to work together to look for the best price and product for the money.

Emergency Management Director Robert Palmer reported that a site evaluation was conducted the previous day with the Motorola design group for equipment located here at the Historic Courthouse and tower site at the community park. Another meeting with the design group is scheduled for March 24th with department heads, County Judge Executive and City Manager. Judge Barnes had a quote of approximately \$475 for material for each of the two Fish and Wildlife Life Jacket Loaner stations as previously discussed and approved. Mr. Palmer has been tasked with overseeing this project, follow-up and monthly reporting of the stations to be located at a couple of locations on Drake's Creek. It has not yet been determined who will construct these stands. Mr. Palmer also would like to offer CPR and AED training classes for the public and wanted to have the blessing of Fiscal Court before proceeding. No one had any objections to his plan.
