At a regular meeting of the Simpson County Fiscal Court held in the Courtroom of the Simpson County Historic Courthouse, Tuesday, March 21, 2023, at 8:30 AM

Present: Honorable Mason Barnes, Judge/Executive Honorable Marty Chandler, East Magistrate Honorable Jeffrey Burr, West Magistrate Honorable Scott Poston, North Magistrate Honorable Myron Thurman, South Magistrate Honorable Sam Phillips, County Attorney Nicole Law, Treasurer Pam Rohrs, Fiscal Court Clerk

County Judge Executive Mason Barnes called the fiscal court meeting to order and Public Works Director Bobby Groves offered the prayer followed by the pledge to

Simpson County Tourism Director Arny Ellis and Nicky Hughes, Curator at the Sandford Duncan Inn and who for many years worked for the State Historical Preservation Society, were present to ask for Fiscal Court help to fund restorations needed at the Sandford Duncan Inn Cemetery. Mrs. Ellis explained that the county owns the property, but Tourism oversees it. Last year the Inn was opened back up to the public for tours from April thru October and plans are to do so again this year but they want to make sure that the much-needed repairs in the cemetery are made before the tours resume this season. The building behind the inn, formerly known and built as the interpretative center, is now used by The Dueling Grounds Distillery as the location of the first craft distillery tasting room in the state. Mr. Hughes said that the cemetery on the property is where Sandford Duncan, who started the inn and kept it going for several decades, and his family as well as neighbors, friends and others are buried. Thomas W. Fugate, an expert in this type of historic restoration, will oversee this project as repairs and improvements are made to the headstones and fence at buried. Hother, and they hope to gravel a path from the inn to the cemetery. This work is scheduled to be done April 4-7h. It was noted that the historical significance of Sandford Duncan Inn and its grounds has secured a position as one of the top ten historical sites in Kentucky making it a tourist attraction for Simpson County.

Judge Barnes reported that per Kenneth Utley, the March 11th collection of storm debris at the designated site received 48 loads and 53 loads on March 18th. This collection site will not be observing the hour lunch break as previously announced. Judge Barnes announced that this year's Scott Waste's Amnesty dates will be Friday and Saturday, April 28th and 29th. He continued by reporting that the Human Rights Commission will have the Women's History Month luncheon at the Blewett Bradley Building Saturday, March 25th at 11:30 AM. The Kentucky Legislature has passed a one-year moratorium on city annexation without county consent until a panel can determine how this type of annexation should look in the future. Its passage was so overwhelmingly in favor that even if the governor vetoes this legislation, it could be over-ridden.

Magistrate Chandler reported that he had encouraged State Representative Shawn McPherson to secure funding to get HWY 585 (Gold City Road) at the bridge straightened and cited the dangerous incident of a state truck and trailer overturning and dumping an excavator onto the highway at this location last week. He encouraged others to contact Representative McPherson and Senator Mike Wilson as well regarding this concern.

County Attorney Sam Phillips reminded folks who have not yet paid their 2022 county property taxes to pay before they become delinquent and are transferred from the Sheriff's Office to the County Clerk's Office April 18th when they will incur more fees. He also reported that the forum at the History Center Monday, March 20th with Kentucky Attorney General Daniel Cameron gathering information from prosecutors, law enforcement, community leaders and others interested in the impact the current epidemic involving opioids and fentanyl was informative. Both Judge Executive Barnes and Attorney Phillips strongly encouraged all to be aware of the dangers of drugs being laced with deadly substances, especially fentanyl and to teach children not to take any medicine from anyone other than trusted sources. Attorney Phillips explained that fentanyl was originally used as elephant tranquilizer and is also transdermal which means that it can be lethal even without being ingested.

Jailer Eric Vaughn encouraged Fiscal Court to be aware of HB 507 which has prompted a lawsuit filed by Jailers Association against the Department of Correction and while it has been set aside for now, he expects it to resurface for consideration and he thinks that it could be detrimental to county jails.

Public Works Director Bobby Groves announced that he plans to close Vances Mill Road (CR-1347) to thru traffic Monday, March 27th for a 500 to 600 feet stretch of road to be milled down to rock and attempt to build it up a couple of feet at the intersection with Chester Mann Road (CR-1307) to eliminate the flooding issue.
