At a regular meeting of the Simpson County Fiscal Court held in the Courtroom of the Simpson County Historic Courthouse, Tuesday, April 15, 2025, at 8:33 AM

Present: Honorable Mason Barnes, Judge/Executive Honorable Jeffrey Burr, West Magistrate Honorable Marty Chandler, East Magistrate Honorable Scott Poston, North Magistrate Honorable Myron Thurman, South Magistrate Honorable Sam Phillips, County Attorney Nicole Law, Treasurer Sydney Downey, Fiscal Court Clerk

County Judge Executive Mason Barnes called the fiscal court meeting to order with prayer, followed by the pledge to the American flag.

Day,

Casey Pedigo, Justin Young, and Joe Plunk with the State Highway Department presented the court rural secondary road program updates in Simpson County. The allotment and carryover from last year was nearly \$1.1 million. 42% went to item one, routine maintenance and traffic on 95 miles of the rural secondary routes. General maintenance consisted of land pipes, stitching, and patching of roads. Item number two was County Judge expenses, \$3,875 came out of that allotment. Item three, fixing base failures; placing inch asphalt resurfacing on 2.2 miles of 622, from the intersection of Craft Road to Warren County line, cost right at \$362,269. Item number four, paving all of Kentucky 2592, from the intersection of 73 to the intersection of 31W. Total for those road repairs estimated around \$162,368. Item number five is Flex Funds, 15% of the initial distribution and no carryover from Flex Funds last year, putting the amount at \$146,632.

Recently completed projects: KY 621 2.7 miles from Robertson Road to 31W and KY 1008 all 6.5 miles of that have been resurfaced. The turning lane at KY 1008 and 31W next to Hunt Ford, project has been awarded. They will also be fixing the curb located there as well.

East magistrate Marty Chandler asked the Highway Department why a left lane couldn't be implemented at 1008 and 31W corner of the Fivestar Gas Station. Mr. Plunk responded with many years ago the owner put a drive on that side when it wasn't prohibited and there was nothing, they could do about it at the time. He also mentioned that the use of that road was for access-controlled highway with designated entrances every 1200ft, and they paid property owners for that loss of access. Mr. Plunk said the owners could pay to have the curb taken out and add a left turn lane, he said if they allowed people to turn left from 1008 traffic would easily get backed up from people waiting to turn.

Questions regarding the light at Hunt Ford 1008 and 31W. They said they are planning on adding a turning lane, so the traffic won't continue to get backed up. Judge Barnes suggested adding a southbound lane starting at O'Reilly's.

Brian Beard, a Public Affeirs Specialist with U.S. Small Business Administration presented to the court information about their company. They work alongside FEMA when there is a presidential disaster declaration, such as what happened from the February flooding. They offer low-interest long-term loans to cover any damage not covered by insurance, FEMA, or another source. They encourage people not to wait for their insurance settlement and get an itemized estimate from a licensed contractor. Loans up to \$50,000 do not require any collateral or closing costs. The deadline for the Fiscal Damage Loans is April 25th, with a 60-day grace period. Businesses have until November 24th to apply for the Working Capital Loans. They can be reached on their online portal, 800-659-2955, or visit the Disaster Recovery Center located in the Courthouse on the 2nd floor.

Building Inspector Jonathan Chandler presented to the court his thoughts on setting rates for building and electrical inspections. The current ordinance on the electrical commercial permit fees is based on 1.3% of a contract amount. He has run into a few permits where the contract amount is lower than what he has listed. When you do that, your permit fees don't cover the inspections. Mr. Chandler wants to say a minimum of \$200 to cover inspections and office fees. This is just for commercial permits, but Mr. Chandler did discuss adding the reinspection fee of \$75 under certain conditions.
